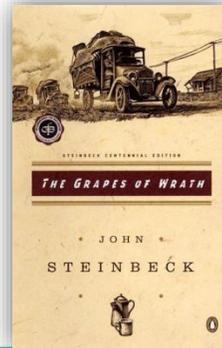


Lexile measures:

- Length of sentences
- Difficulty of vocabulary

Lexile DOES NOT measure:

- If a book is age-appropriate
- The quality of the book
- The number of pages in a book

So, how do you find a book in your Lexile range that is also age-appropriate *and* something that you want to read?

Our favorite tool for finding great books in your Lexile range is :

Novelist

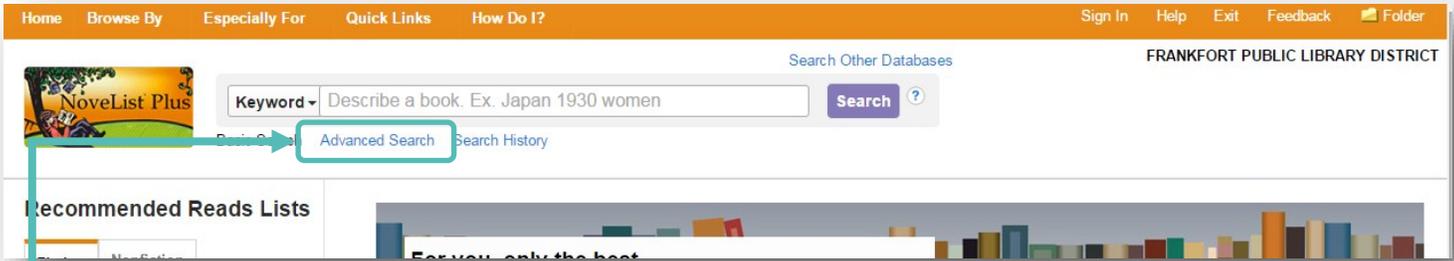
This guide will show you how to use the Novelist database.

Some books are given a letter code in addition to their Lexile score. Here is a quick guide:

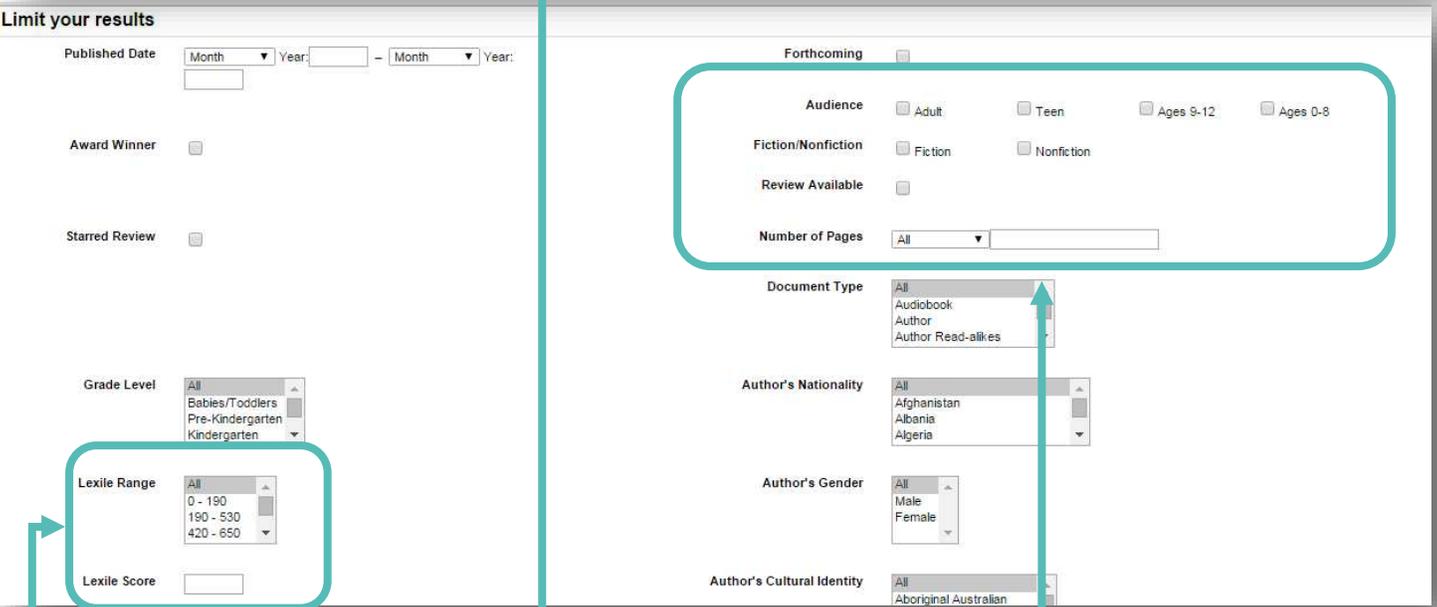
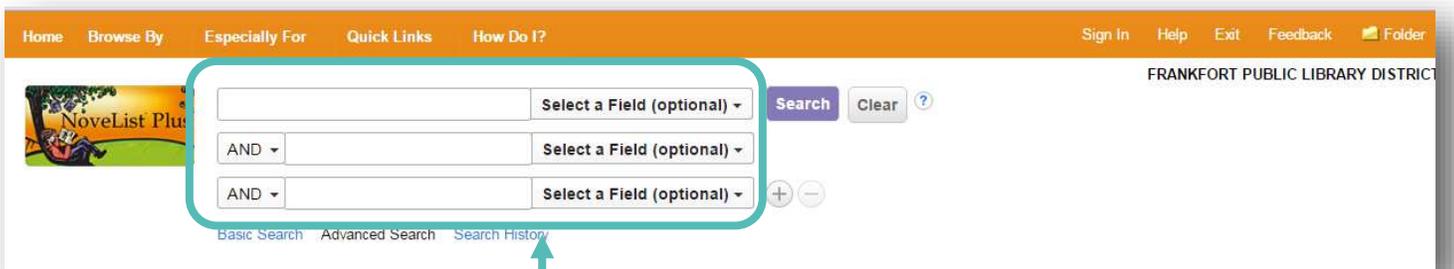
- AD Adult Directed:** these books are typically intended to be read to children by an adult.
- NC Non-Conforming:** these books have a reading level that is higher than the intended audience.
- HL High-Low:** these books have a reading level that is lower than the intended audience.
- BR Beginning Reader:** written for children who are learning how to read, these books have a score lower than 0 on the Lexile scale.
- IG Illustrated Guide:** these books are made up of boxes of text scattered on the page.
- NP Non-Prose:** books in which 50% or more of the text is not prose (ie. Plays, poetry).
- GN Graphic Novel:** indicates that the title is a graphic novel, as opposed to traditional prose.

1 Go to www.frankfortlibrary.org and click on the **Research** tab.

2 Scroll down the list of databases and click on **Novelist Plus**. You may be asked to enter your 14-digit Frankfort library card number.



3 Click on **Advanced Search**.



4 Select the **Lexile Range** that most closely matches your Lexile score.

5 Enter one or more **Subject** terms or **Key Words** related to what you want to read about.

(For example: “dogs,” “mystery,” or “football.”)

6 You can also select other limiters such as **Audience** and **Fiction** or **Non-Fiction**.

When you are finished, click **Search**.

- Make sure the Lexile is correct!
- Click this link to see if Frankfort Library has a copy of the book.

Hints

- If you get too many results, try adding more search terms or use the **Refine Results** section on the left-hand side of the screen.
- If you don't get many results, try removing some search terms, or make your search terms more broad. For example, if you are looking for a book that is similar to the Percy Jackson series and that is Fiction, Ages 9-12, and a Lexile Range of 740-940:

Using the keywords "Percy Jackson" yields around 11 results.

Using the keywords "greek mythology" yields around 25 results.

Using the keyword "mythology" yields around 65 results.
